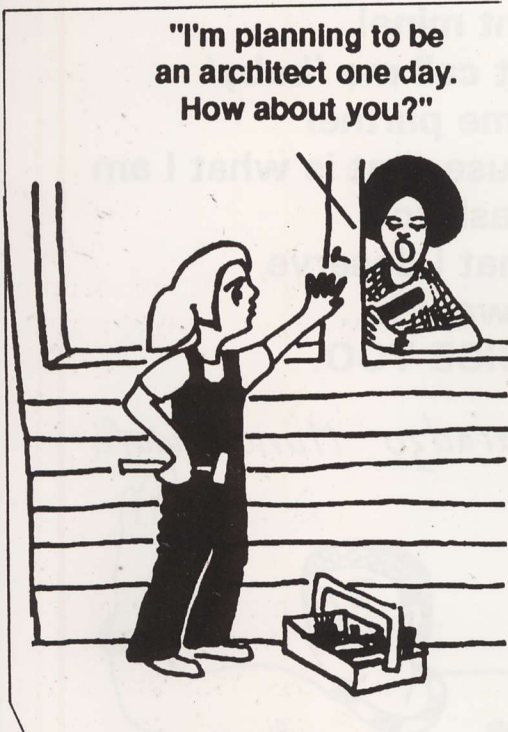


How nice!

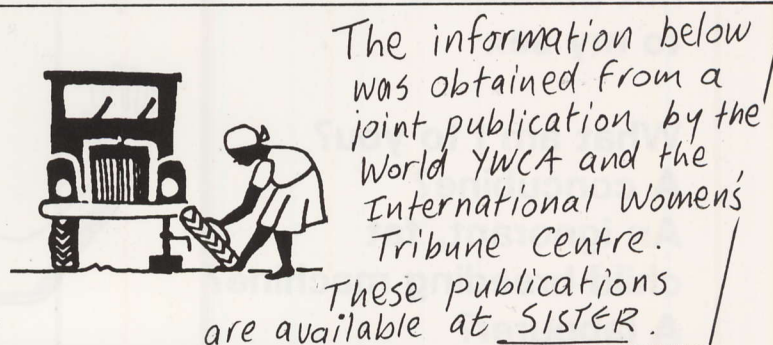
